WHY THIS ONE MATTERS

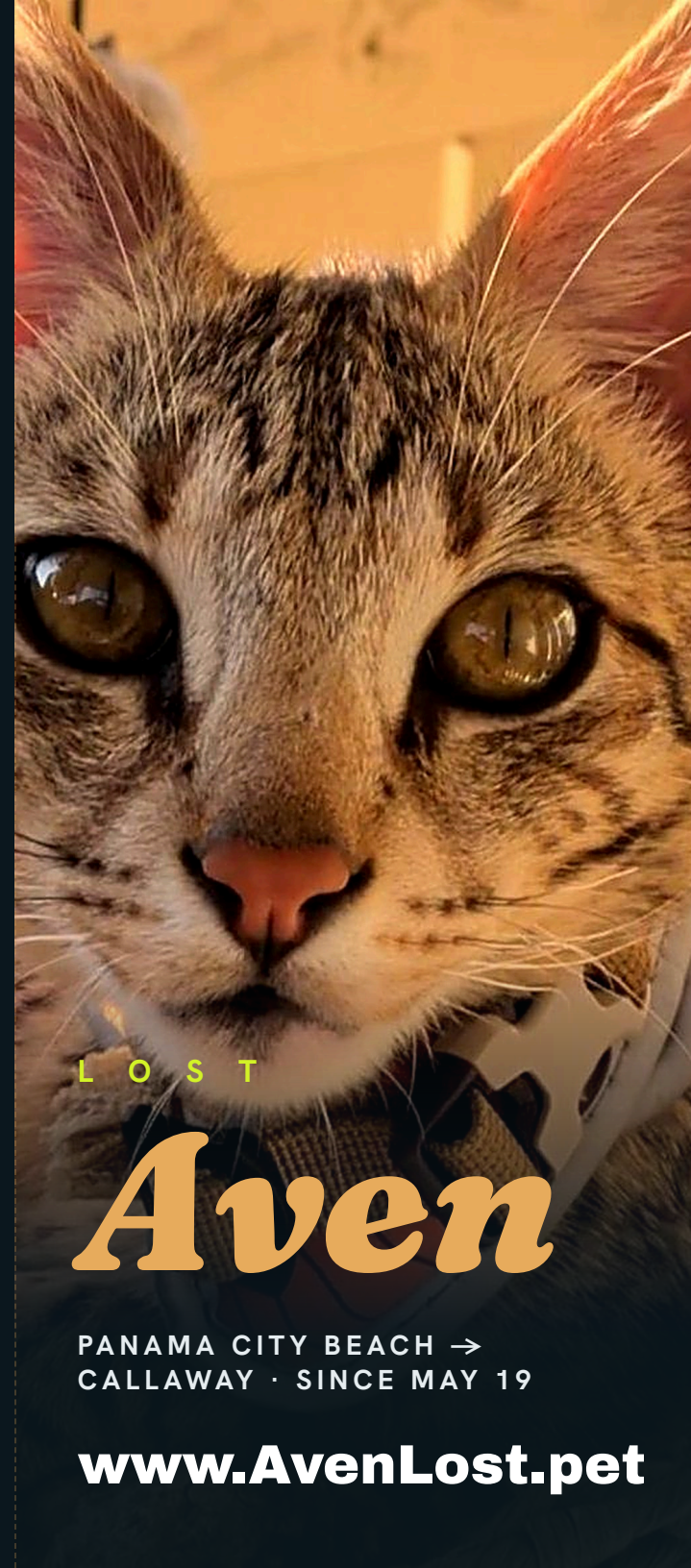
Aven is the emotional support animal

KNOW HIM IN THREE SECONDS



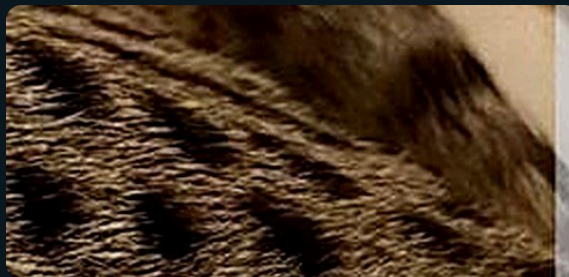
Round black spots

Ringed to a dark tip. He may look thin and rough by now.

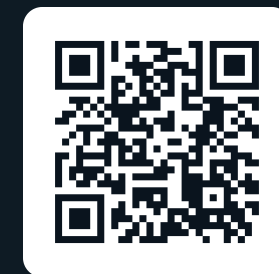
WHAT TO DO
